



GETTING TO EXETER

Exeter International Airport: If you are flying from mainland Europe or Toronto, you may be able to fly directly to Exeter International Airport: www.exeterairport.co.uk. The main airline that flies into Exeter is Flybe (British European): www.flybe.com. Exeter International Airport is a 20 minute taxi ride from the Streatham Campus.

Heathrow Airport: If you are flying to Heathrow Airport, you can get to Exeter by coach (bus) from the Heathrow Central Bus Station (www.nationalexpress.com). This is the cheapest option. Alternatively, you can take the Heathrow Express to London Paddington (www.heathrowexpress.com) and then the train to Exeter St David's station (www.firstgreatwestern.co.uk). You can buy your ticket from Paddington to Exeter in advance (and save) or purchase it upon arrival at Paddington. The train costs twice as much as the coach, but it is a faster and a more comfortable way to travel. Once at Exeter St David's station, the Streatham Campus is a five minute taxi ride away.

Gatwick Airport: If you are flying to Gatwick Airport, take the Gatwick Express to London Victoria train station (www.gatwickexpress.com) and then the bus from Victoria coach station, which is a five minute walk away (www.nationalexpress.com). Once at Exeter Bus Station, the Streatham Campus is a five minute taxi ride away.

Buy your coach ticket in advance: If you plan on taking the coach, you should book with National Express (www.nationalexpress.com) in advance, since coaches sometimes sell out a day before departure.

Taxi fares: Standard taxi fare to Streatham Campus from Exeter St David's train station, Exeter Bus Station, or the Exeter town centre is £4–5.
