

## SSIS Governance for Sustainability

The University has an [Environmental Sustainability Policy](#) which was agreed by the Vice-Chancellors Executive Group which was last reviewed and updated in March 2013. The policy outlines the University's environmental objectives and provides a clear commitment to comply with relevant environmental legislation, regulations and other requirements. Progress against the policy is reviewed annually by the Dual Assurance team.

Within the College the overall responsibility for sustainability lies with the Dean. Responsibility for compliance with relevant legislation (eg waste management and pollution prevention) lies with the College Manager and Heads of Discipline supported by the ACM Infrastructure and Technical Services. Responsibility for day to day sustainability matters and queries is devolved through the College Manager to the ACM I&TS

Sustainability forms part of the agenda at College Health & Safety meetings which are held once a term in the context of full EXEC meetings.

The College encourages members of staff to become local sustainability co-ordinators to lead on improving environmental performance within their areas. If you are interested in becoming a sustainability co-ordinator please contact the ACM I&TS (Joanna Lunnon).
